In his new role as Senior Vice President, Antoine will build on the success of his tenure as City Leader in Dallas over the last 10 years where he has established himself and All Stars as critical voices in the local civic and nonprofit community.

Antoine is charged with expanding the influence of the ASP's performatory developmental approach to nonprofits, education and youth development organizations. Shadae will also continue to lead the remote programs of the ASP, including the virtual Development School for Youth and the Development Coaching programs, as well as the Social Development Partners training and development initiative.

As Director, she will continue to function as market leader responsible for the ongoing growth of the ASP of New Jersey business. She will advance the strategy and direct the planning and

execution of all programming, operations, fundraising and community-building activities. Additionally, Shadae will continue to actively lead the development of philanthropic partnerships.



Shadae first met ASP when she attended a New Jersey Afterschool Development Conference in 2014. A year later, she was hired by ASP of New Jersey as a Senior Program Manager and promoted to Director of Youth Programs six months later. Shadae was named City Leader in 2020, and VP/Strategic Initiatives and Director in 2023. She has played a key role in the expansion of the DSY to Jersey City and the launch of Operation Conversation: Cops & Kids in partnership with Mayor Ras Baraka and the Newark Police Division and she spearheaded ASP's partnership with Onyx Equities resulting in ASP of New Jersey's new Campus for Performance and Development at the Gateway Center.



Shadae was named as one of ROI-NJ's 2023 *Influencers: People of Color* and by Newark Venture Partners as one of the *10 Bad Ass [Girl] Bosses of Brick City*. She is a graduate of the Kellogg Executive Development Program and she earned a bachelor's degree in health sciences at Howard University and a master's degree in social work from Rutgers University.
