Our Game-Changing Partnership with LEAP

The transformative power of partnership was on full display at our recent Martin Luther King (MLK) Day celebration, where ASP joined forces with LEAP, one of the city's most vibrant in-school arts education organizations. On January 20, over 115 young people, alumni and volunteers gathered to experience The Movement, An Acapella Musical performed by LEAP Artists LIVE! The production, written and directed by performing artist Kathy D. Harrison, brought the Children's Crusade of 1963 to life through monologues, rhythmic movement and harmonious singing.

The performance showcased the exciting potential of our emerging partnership with LEAP as young people worked alongside ASP staff and LEAP artists to create and perform their own MLK tributes. Special thanks go to **Dr. Jessie Fields**, Vice Chair of the ASP of NY Board, for her moving poem, and **Rich Souto**, LEAP's Executive Director, who shares our vision to create a multi-nonprofit center by 2026.

BUILDING TOMORROW TOGETHER: Our Philanthropic Community Steps Forward

To ensure that our vision becomes reality, we have launched a \$10 million campaign that will allow us to pay off the building's mortgage and create a sustainable foundation for strategic partnerships, new programming, capacity building and facility maintenance. I am proud to share that Gabrielle Kurlander and I have made a leadership gift toward the campaign, along with other members of our board of directors, and we have already raised \$2.55 million in leadership gifts from five board members.

Our goal is to have \$3.5 million raised by March 31 st—our first major campaign milestone. Email me or call me if you would like to find a way to help make that possible.

In March, our development team, led by Chief Development Officer **Jenny Zak**, will begin contacting our New York City and national philanthropic base for special one-time investments in this transformative project. This campaign is crucial for maximizing the flexibility with which ASP can provide leadership to the arts and non-profit community hit hard by the impact of COVID-19 on public life in New York City. 
