A NATIONAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITY Dallas Works 2025: A Groundbreaking Public/Private Partnership

In May 2024, we announced the public phase of our ambitious **ten-year Becoming All Stars Campaign**, designed to transform the lives of 100,000 underserved youth and raise \$150 million by 2027. I am thrilled to share that as of February 2025, **we have already raised \$103,175,865 toward our campaign goal**, a milestone made possible by the unwavering support of our incredible All Stars community, including individuals, foundations, and partner organizations. Together, we are breaking the cycle of poverty through our **FREE**, **transformative development-through-performance programs.**

This year, we are launching bold new initiatives that showcase the growth of our mission. One key national priority in 2025 is the work we are leading in Dallas, where the All Stars Project is powering **Mayor Eric L. Johnson's youth employment program**, **Dallas Works**. Dallas Works is a program designed to empower young people ages 16 to 21 with career readiness experiences that truly make an impact.

All Stars Project will engage
over 1,000 young people in
professional performance
workshops this year. Even more exciting,
over 100 youth from underserved
communities will receive paid internships
across local businesses, nonprofits, and
government agencies—bringing their
potential to life while shaping the next
generation of leaders in Dallas.



What Is Unique About Our Model?

For over 25 years, ASP's **Development School for Youth (DSY)** has been a national model for youth workforce development with nearly 7,000 graduates who secured paid internships with leading companies. Our legacy of impact has allowed us to refine a best-practice approach to youth workforce solutions that is shaping **our partnership with Dallas Works**. **By combining performance-based programming with a commitment to excellence, we are building a program that will benefit both youth and employers.**





PREPARATION FOR YOUTH

We provide young people with intensive performance workshops that build on our Eight Dimensions of Development—honing their networking, interview, resume writing, and public speaking skills, which cultivates lasting confidence. By doing so, we ensure they are internship-ready and poised to thrive. "Before joining the All Stars, I never thought there was a way to pair workplace skills and theatrical performance, and now, I take every opportunity that comes my way."



PREPARATION FOR ADULTS

Across the country, we equip our corporate partners, internship supervisors, and adult volunteers with the tools to guide and uplift young people in their personal and professional development. Through our dynamic **Supervisor Development Workshop**, both new and returning internship supervisors gain firsthand insight into bridging cultural gaps—engaging directly with DSY alumni and experiencing our powerful development-through-performance approach in action. "The DSY program provides excellent internship preparation, so we felt confident in giving all our DSY interns the tools they needed to succeed, rather than being overly hands-on."



ONGOING SUPPORT

Throughout the DSY, Dallas Works, and Summer Internship Programs, we remain actively engaged, providing hands-on support to both companies and young participants to foster a seamless and impactful experience. Our programs are intentionally designed to bridge worlds—connecting ambitious inner-city youth with dedicated business professionals eager to make a difference. "Knowing I have a dedicated connection at All Stars—someone I can always call or email—has been a game-changer for me as a supervisor, strengthening both my role and our relationship with our interns."



FEEDBACK LOOP

Through surveys, data analysis, and continuous program evaluation, we gather insights from young people and our caring adult partners that allow us to consistently improve, innovate, and deliver exceptional outcomes for youth, businesses, and communities alike. "By focusing on proximal outcomes rather than long-term academic results, we have better information to help us determine what transpires when outside-of-school programs focus on personal and professional development for marginalized youth."
